# How to Prepare

- Present your best self

  - o Professional attire
  - Professional attitude

  - Well groomed
- Prepare your resume and bring multiple copies including access to an electronic version
- Rehearse your first impression
  - Practice your handshake
  - o Prepare and practice your greeting and introduction
  - o Describe your knowledge, skills and ability with confidence
  - Ask thoughtful questions
- Finish Strong
  - Ask for next steps in their hiring process
  - Ask for contact information/business card
  - o Reaffirm interest and follow-up with a brief written note

### What to Expect

Employers across multiple industries including health care, manufacturing, law, banking and investment, entertainment, gaming, energy, education, transportation and media.

- Plan ahead and determine what employers you would like to visit and make them a priority.
- Research your identified priority employers (location(s), # of employees, products and/or services, etc.).

Onsite Check-In and Registration.

- There will be separate registration stations for pre-registrants and onsite registrants.
- Volunteers will be available to assist you if you need help.

### What Not to Expect

The convention will have a variety of employers across different industries, but not all Baltimore City employers will be present.

Admission of children under the age of 18 in not permitted; child care or babysitting services and pets (except service animals).



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#### What to Expect

After you complete check in/registration, you will receive a name badge, program booklet with schedule of events, a map of employer and exhibitor locations, a tote, and the schedule of convention classes, workshops and seminars. You will also have the option of attending a miniorientation.

Access to free, on-site legal assistance for criminal record expungement.

Access to free, on-site, state of the art computer lab for resume preparation.

Opportunities for 1:1, face-to-face conversations with private and public sector employers including Baltimore City Agencies.

Free shuttle service is available in designated locations to/from the Baltimore Convention Center. https://workbaltimore.baltimorecity.gov/

Some employers may conduct onsite interviews and extend contingent job offers.

You will be provided with an opportunity to describe your WorkBaltimore experience.

90 days Post- Convention Follow-up.

Opportunities to start and build your professional network.

Food and beverages may be purchased at the convention center.

#### What Not to Expect

Not every record can be expunged. For a list on what types of charges can be expunged and required documentation visit

Individual time with employers will be limited and you may only have a few minutes to make a first impression.

Some employers may not accept your printed resume. Many companies require candidates to apply online.

Food and beverage will not be provided.
